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# Rule Changes 2025 – Minimum Duration/Hours

- 8 Months minimum duration from 1<sup>st</sup> August 2025.
- Duration does not link to Off The Job hours.
- Off The Job Hours now published against every individual standard.
- Eligible Apprenticeship Programmes – minimum 187 hours OTJT.
- RPLE (Recognised Prior Learning and Experience) must be discussed and applied to training hours.

# Changes to a Growth & Skills Levy

- **1<sup>st</sup> January 2026** - Level 7 apprenticeship standards funded only for 16-21 years and under 25 for care leavers & those with an EHCP (with a few exceptions i.e. nursing)
- Growth & Skills Levy - Apprenticeship Units **from April 2026** – 1<sup>st</sup> wave available in critical skills areas such as Digital, Engineering, Advanced AI.

## Immediate funding change:

SME's co-investment model of 5% contribution continues but aged under 25 years will be fully funded by the government.

## 1<sup>st</sup> April funding change:

Levy payers – no 10% top up to funds by government, 25% contribution expected if levy runs dry, levy funds expire after 12 months instead of 24 months.



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# Changes to the Structure of an Apprenticeship Standard

## What to look for:

- **Assessment Plans** replace End Point Assessment Plans.
- No more End Point Assessment; replaced by **Apprenticeship Assessment**.
- End Point Assessment Organisations replaced by **Assessment Organisations**.
- Gateway replaced by **Gateway to Completion** (existing structure: on-programme training, gateway, end point assessments).
- **Assessment** – refers to Assessment during the course of the apprenticeship or towards the end and which contributes to the final grade.
- Grades will be a **Pass** or **Distinction**, no more Merit.

## Implementation

- Expert pool – brings together the draft plan.
- Approved.
- Plan published.
- Assessment Organisations organise and create assessments.
- Assessment Plan goes live for delivery

**Target for roll out 2026** – 1<sup>st</sup> assessment plans created and approved (Assistant Accountant, Early Years Educator, Data Technician) awaiting decision for delivery.

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# New Assessment Plans – Knowledge & Skills

Mandatory Qualifications:

**Will be allowed for one of the following reasons only:**

- Qualification is regulatory or a legal requirement to operate in the occupation.
- Qualification required for professional body membership.
- Qualification has currency in labour market and would disadvantage an apprentice without it.



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# New Assessment Plans - Behaviours

- **Employers** responsible for **behaviours** (part of the components of the 'completion to gateway' stage).
- **Providers** and **Assessment Organisations** - **not required to assess or quality assure** employer judgements.

Further guidance to be published from Skills England.
